Additionally, the results of the multiplier events were shared, showcasing their crucial role in knowledge dissemination and the consolidation of collaboration networks.

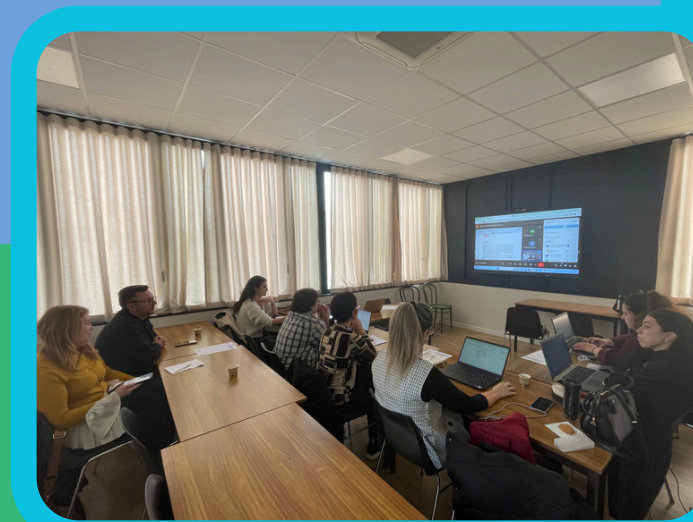

### Project management and evaluation: Final steps

In the project management section, pending tasks for the preparation of the final report were reviewed, ensuring that all milestones and administrative requirements are met. Additionally, a quality assessment was conducted, including a detailed analysis of the project's impact and the extent to which the established KPIs were met.

### Validation and certification of skills: Results and recommendations

One of the central topics of the meeting was the second pilot phase of skills validation, where VET teachers and trainers provided valuable feedback on the effectiveness of the implemented processes. Thanks to these contributions, the final recommendations document was presented, consolidating a framework for the certification of key skills in vocational education and training environments.



### Conclusions and next steps

The meeting concluded with a Q&A session, where partners reaffirmed their commitment to quality and the implementation of the results. The final certification of project participation marked the closure of an intense and enriching process, but also the beginning of new opportunities for cooperation. BCOMP has laid solid foundations for skills validation in work-based learning, and its legacy is projected towards a future where vocational education will be increasingly innovative, accessible, and aligned with labour market needs.
